This correspondence refers to the removal of three underground storage tanks (USTs) at the old bus barn of the Kayenta Unified School District #27, located in Kayenta, Arizona, on land of the Navajo Nation. Regulatory oversight was provided by Mr. Henry Haven from the Navajo Nation EPA (NNEPA).

Our review of the closure documents and analytical results for soil samples collected at the UST site indicates no hydrocarbon concentrations above appropriate EPA, Region IX or NNEPA soil cleanup levels.

The information submitted has assisted EPA and NNEPA in assessing the status of this site, where three USTs were removed on December 5, 2000. This site does not appear to pose a current threat to human health and the environment. Therefore, EPA is not requiring further action at this time.

If new USTs are installed at the site, Tank Notification Form #7530-1 must be completed and sent to this office within 30 days after startup of the new UST system.
