This correspondence refers to the monitoring report dated September 30, 1998 prepared by Basin Engineering, Inc. for the Fina #105 Service Station, located in Kayenta, Arizona, on land of the Navajo Nation.

The information submitted has assisted EPA in assessing the status of this site, where one unregistered underground storage tank (UST) was removed in 1991/92 by the previous owner, Sandia Oil Company. This tank was a source of soil and groundwater contamination, which has now been cleaned up by a soil vapor extraction system and natural attenuation. The five existing USTs were upgraded to 1998 requirements by Sandia Oil Company in 1992. The site was acquired by Giant Four Corners on November 10, 1993. This site does not appear to pose a current threat to human health and the environment. EPA is not requiring further action at this time.
