Dear Ms. Myers:

This correspondence refers to your letter dated December 30, 1998 and the enclosed documentation related to the remediation of contaminated soils at the Moenkopi Substation, located 3.5 miles southwest of Cameron, Arizona, on land of the Navajo Nation. Contaminated soils were encountered during the removal of one 500-gallon underground storage tank (UST) on May 31, 1994.

Approximately 250 cubic yards of contaminated soil were land farmed at the site. The most recent analytical results for samples of this soil indicate contaminant levels below the maximum established by the Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency.

The information submitted has assisted EPA in assessing the status of this site. This site does not appear to pose a current threat to human health and the environment. EPA is not requiring further action at this time.
