
This correspondence refers to the 14- Day Report dated July 15, 1994 regarding the A. T. & T Winkelman site located on land of the San Carlos Apache Tribe. Because this site is located on Indian Trust land it was transferred from the Arizona Department of Environmental Quality to the jurisdiction of the USEPA on July 20, 1994.

EPA's understanding of the status of this site, after a file review, is as follows:

- \* On April 16, 1992, one 3000 gallon Diesel Underground Storage Tank(UST) was removed from the site.
- \* Approximately 20 cubic yards of contaminated soil was stockpiled on plastic sheeting at the site. Subsequently the soil was subjected to Bio-remediation. Analytical results from soil samples taken in September 1992 were below action levels for TPH and BTEX. Soils were spread on site in the summer of 1994.
- \* Analytical results of samples taken in the tank pit and along product lines showed non- detect for both TPH and BTEX.

The information submitted has assisted EPA in assessing the status of this site. It does not appear to currently pose a threat to human health and the environment. No further action is required by EPA at this time.
