Dear Mr. Shellabarger:

This correspondence refers to the underground storage tank (UST) removal report that was prepared by Rocky Mountain Petroleum for the removal of two USTs located at the Sunrise Sports Center in McNary, Arizona, on land of the White Mountain Apache Tribe. This report was received by our office on February 10, 2000. In accordance with 40 CFR §280.71 and based on the October 7, 1998 removal date, the closure report should have been submitted to this office no later than December 31, 1998.

Our review of the closure documents and analytical results for soil samples collected at the UST site indicates no hydrocarbon concentrations above appropriate EPA, Region IX or tribal soil cleanup levels.

The information submitted has assisted EPA in assessing the status of this site, where two 10,000-gallon USTs were removed on October 7, 1998. This site does not appear to pose a current threat to human health and the environment. Therefore, EPA is not requiring further action at this time.
