The U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) has received the closure report regarding the removal of two underground storage tanks (USTs) at the Bureau of Indian Affairs Land Operations site, located in Sacaton, Arizona, on land of the Gila River Indian Community.

Analytical results from the samples taken at each tank end and along the product pipes were below the laboratory detection levels.

The information submitted has assisted EPA in assessing the status of this site, where two USTs were removed on June 4, 1998. This site does not appear to pose a current threat to human health and the environment. EPA is not requiring further action at this time.

If new USTs are installed at the site, Tank Notification Form # 7530-1 must be completed and sent to this office within 30 days after startup of the new UST system. A copy of this form is enclosed for your information.
