This correspondence refers to the analytical results dated July 15, 1999 for the composite sample taken at the stockpile of contaminated soil excavated during the removal of three 10,000-gallon underground storage tanks (USTs) from the school transportation yard on February 2, 1993. The school facilities are located on land of the Navajo Nation.

Our review of the analytical results for the composite sample collected at the UST site indicates no hydrocarbon concentrations above appropriate EPA, Region IX or tribal soil cleanup levels.

Based on the information submitted, this site does not appear to pose a current threat to human health and the environment. EPA is not requiring further action at this time.

If new USTs are installed at the site, Tank Notification Form #7530-1 must be completed and sent to this office within 30 days after startup of the new UST system.
