This correspondence refers to your letter dated December 1, 1997 and the attached underground storage tank (UST) removal report for the Navajo National Monument, which is within the Navajo National Park.


The information submitted has assisted the U. S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) in assessing the status of this site, where two USTs were removed on December 2, 1996. Our records indicate there are no other USTs in or out of service at this site.

This site does not appear to currently pose a threat to human health and the environment. EPA is not requiring further action at this time with respect to the Navajo National Monument site.

Above ground storage tanks (ASTs) have replaced the old USTs.
