

Thank you for your letter dated February 27, 2007 requesting information for the above referenced site.

Based on information in our file, a report dated September 24, 2003 prepared by Underground Analytical, Inc. Post Office Box 30220, Flagstaff, Arizona 86003 (Telephone Number 1.800.660.1353), the site is located off Interstate 40, at Exit 351, Allentown, Arizona.

Underground Analytical, Inc. removed two 10,000 gallon tanks on June 2, 2003 and Mr. Henry Haven, Jr., Geologist, Navajo Nation Environmental Protection Agency, monitored the tank removal activities. Four soil samples were collected underneath each tank and analyzed for BTEX and Total Petroleum Hydrocarbons. The analytical results indicated that there were no levels above the EPA Maximum Contaminant Levels (MCL).

However, additional samples were collected by Underground Analytical, Inc. on August 9, 2005 and according to a report dated September 2, 2005 the analytical results for TPH and BTEX confirmed that the EPA MCL's were not exceeded.

A closure letter to state that "No Further Action" is required for this site is pending. If you require a copy of this letter, please submit your request to me in writing.
